MUIS HALAL CERTIFICATE TERMS AND CONDITIONS

General

- 1 This Halal certificate issued by Majlis Ugama Islam Singapura (Muis), also known as 'Islamic Religious Council of Singapore', under the 'Catering Scheme' is applicable to *Singapore-based food caterers*.
- 2 This Halal certificate is issued subject to the Muis Halal Certification Terms and Conditions (available at www.muis.gov.sg) which must be fully complied by the Halal certificate holder.
- 3 This Halal certificate is **NOT transferable**. A fresh Halal application must be immediately submitted via the Muis eHalal System (<http://ehalal.muis.gov.sg>) for any change to the name of premises and location.
- 4 This Halal certificate remains the property of Muis. It must be surrendered to Muis immediately upon request, cessation of business or within 1 week from the expiry date of the certificate.
- 5 The Halal certificate holder is responsible for the safe-keeping of the certificate. Loss or theft of the certificate must be reported immediately to the police. A copy of the police report must be extended to Muis for a replacement of the certificate within 7 days of such loss being discovered.
- 6 **Invalid, expired, photocopied and spoilt Halal certificate must NOT be displayed.** New/duplicate original certificate is available at Muis.
- 7 In the event of any breach of the Muis Halal Certification Terms and Conditions, Muis reserves the right to suspend or withdraw the certificate. All Halal certificates and Halal certification marks that have been suspended or withdrawn must be removed from public display and surrendered to Muis immediately.
- 8 Any unauthorised possession of this Halal certificate is not allowed. If found, the certificate must be handed back to Muis or any neighbourhood police centre/post.
- 9 Use, retention, reproduction, alteration, destruction or transfer of this Halal certificate without the approval of Muis is not permitted
- 10 Any person who, without the approval of MUIS, misuses the Halal certificate or Halal certification mark shall be guilty of an offence under Section 88A of the Administration of Muslim Law Act (Cap. 3).

Renewal of Expired Halal Certificate

- 11 A renewal application must be submitted via the Muis eHalal System (<http://ehalal.muis.gov.sg>) **not less than 1 month before** the expiry date of the existing certificate, failing which, a new application has to be made and the stipulated fee paid.
- 12 This Halal certificate must be returned to Muis **within 1 week from the date of its expiry**.
- 13 Should the Halal certificate holder fail to obtain renewal of the certificate before its expiry date, he/she must cease to display the expired certificate, use any Halal certification marks or make any form of Halal claims.

Others

- 14 Muis reserves the right to alter or amend any of the above terms and conditions and the Muis Halal Certification Terms and Conditions from time to time, without prior notice.
